WYMESWOLD PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES

A meeting of Wymeswold Parish Council was held both virtually via Zoom and in person at the Sports Pavilion on Burton Lane, Wymeswold on Monday 3rd April 2023 at 7:00pm. Parishioners were welcome to attend in person OR via Zoom.

Attendees: Cllr Richard Higgins (Acting Chair), Cllr Kevin Sayce, Cllr David Albert, Cllr Tom Simpson, Borough Cllr Jenny Bokor and Clare Higgins (Clerk). **Attendees via Zoom:** Cllr Laura Mills (Chair) and County Cllr Richard Shepherd

1. Apologies: It was resolved to accept apologies from: Cllr Adrian Cooke.

Borough Cllr Jenny Bokor joined the meeting at 7.05pm.

- 2. Declarations of Interest or Requests for Dispensation: None.
- 3. Public Participation: Eliot Moreland (consent to use his name was obtained at the meeting) attended and spoke to the Council about reforming Wymeswold Football Club for this year's upcoming season August/September 2023. He explained it would be a Men's Saturday first team with home games every other week and was requesting the possibility of using the Sports Pavilion facilities and the football pitch.
- **4. Approval of previous minutes:** The meeting approved minutes from the WPC meeting held on Monday 6th March 2023.
- 5. Leicestershire County Council Report: County Cllr Richard Shepherd attended the meeting via Zoom and reported that the location of the replacement speed indicator sign (SID) that has been applied for from the Members' Highway Fund has been specified, and the process to install it is underway. He also mentioned that a review of LCC supported bus services has begun. The number 8 service is the second batch to be reviewed, which will be later this year. County Cllr Richard Shepherd also highlighted that the Government has announced extra funding for Councils for pothole repairs.
- 6. Charnwood Borough Council Report: Borough Cllr Jenny Bokor informed the Council that the New Local Plan should be in place by September. She also reported that Charnwood has recently completed gutter clearance in Wymeswold. Obviously, areas which were obstructed by parked cars could not be cleared. Borough Cllr Jenny Bokor also made the Council aware of a new solar farm which will be located on the land east of Loughborough on the south side of the A60.

County Cllr Richard Shepherd and Borough Cllr Jenny Bokor left the meeting at 7.45pm.

15. Landscaping, Environment and Biodiversity:

a) Cllr Cooke could not be present but sent some information to the Clerk for report to the Council on his behalf. The recently planted bulbs outside Orchard Way are in flower and look splendid, as do all the bulbs the team have planted in recent years. Our grounds maintenance contractors have been instructed to mow less often this season to allow wildflowers to grow in the verges. This is in line with advice from the Royal Horticultural Society (RHS) and the Wildlife Trusts, who are greatly concerned at the sharp decline in insect numbers both nationally and globally. They believe that by cutting the grass less often wildflowers will have a chance to grow and provide nectar and pollen for insects. The new contractor for the Cemetery and Churchyard will be encouraging wildlife by planting wildflowers and installing bird boxes in the Cemetery. Wildflower seeds and wildflower plugs have been sowed/planted along the bank of the river Mantle along Brook Street.

16. Cemetery:

a) There is one upcoming interment due this month in the Cemetery so far.

17. Section 106 and Village Projects:

a) No update was required.

18. Sports Pavilion and Playing Field:

a) The Council discussed and approved the use of the Sports Pavilion and Sports Field by Wymeswold FC for the upcoming 2023-2024 season and the costs which will be associated with that.

19. Clerk's Report:

- A list of contact details for parishioners to report a problem is on the village website, village noticeboard, and Christian Link along with a flood contacts page. The Council would actively encourage parishioners to report village issues using this contacts list.
- The annual inspection of the Memorial Hall and Washdyke playgrounds by ROSPA Playsafety is scheduled for May.

- The boundary fence of the Sports Field is intended to be replaced the week of the 24th April 2023.
- A damaged section of the bank of the Brook which is exposing a pipe and causing the curb to fall in was reported to LCC on 29/03/2023. We are still awaiting a response from them.
- The white concrete posts/railings on Hoton Road/Burton Lane junction have now been repaired by LCC.
- Forthcoming Temporary Traffic Restriction Orders:
 - **a.** A46 Six Hills to Dalby National Highways will be carrying our essential maintenance work to the embankment and drainage. This will be completed between **13**th **March 2023** and **mid-May 2023**.
 - b. Melton Road, Burton on the Wolds for M+J Evans Construction safely undertake carriageway resurfacing works in connection with the new William Davis development. The TTRO will incorporate a temporary road closure. The duration of the restriction is not anticipated to exceed a period of 2 days commencing on Saturday 29th April 2023.
 - c. Zouch Road, Hathern to allow LCC to safely undertake investigation works on the bridge deck. The TTRO will incorporate a temporary road closure. The duration of the restriction is not anticipated to exceed a period of 1 day 9am-3pm commencing on the 10th May 2023.
- A volunteer position for the Wymeswold Public Footpath Warden is still vacant.

20. Church Wall and Clock:

- a) Cllr Mills informed the Council that the new Church Clock repairer has been to repair the Clock and it is now working. She will liaise with the repairer regarding future maintenance.
- b) Cllr Higgins informed the Council that three quotes have been received for the repair of the Church Wall and these will now be shared with our Church Architect to assess them. This will allow the Council to move forward with the process of selecting a contractor.

21. Parishioner Queries: None.

22. Items for further consideration: The state of the verges around Queen's Park, Brook Street and London Lane was raised. This matter has been taken up by Borough Cllr Jenny Bokor, who has informed County Cllr Richard Shepherd of the issue, and he committed to inform the Council of any updates regarding this.
